- 2) A vote of thanks was offered to Sukey as outgoing treasure. The need to find a new person to take on the role was note. It was decided that Luke consult with Lisa Pounders and reach out to Society, about applying to be Treasurer (Financial Background being essential) and also to see if there was a member of the Society who could offer legal advice to the board.
- 3) The formation of a new not for profit organisation to deal with the contractual arrangements for the Society's annual conference was discussed, along with the possibility of event insurance. The possibility of regular conference bases on the East and West Coast were discussed. Lisa Pounders agreed to explore options at the University of Asheville and Heather Taylor Zimmerman to explore The Evergreen State College which has an indigenous arts program.
